MEDITATE

What if God's law were "written on our hearts"? Instruction would no longer be needed, since genuine joy and praise, compassion and justice would all be second nature. The prophet Jeremiah declares that such days "are surely coming;" in the meantime, we may learn from the Spirit through a thousand teachers all around us. To walk with Oliver is to join her in this kind of mindful day-to-day learning, all for the sake of that day when instruction is no longer necessary.

<u>Swallowtail Jig - Irish Fiddle Tune!</u> It's St. Patrick's on Sunday, so what better way to celebrate than with the Swallowtail Jig? It's a classic fiddling tune. Jigs are usually dances in a compound meter, meaning that each beat is subdivided into 3 parts, rather than 2, which is more common (and called "simple").

I Bind Unto Myself This Day (Tune: St Patrick's Breastplate - llvv) [with lyrics for congregations] And of course this hymn, said to have been written by Patrick himself. There's some good background in the description under the video. The words are quite dense, and it's one of the longest hymns (Il verses, with two different melodies), so I'd make a cup of tea, maybe a fire if you have some peat around, and settle in.
