Enso Quartet: Ravel String Quartet: II. Assez vif. Très rythme Maurice Ravel wrote his only string quartet when he was 28, and it's one of the most popular ones ever written. This is the second movement, and starts with lots of pizzicato (plucking the strings), maybe evoking a guitar, and neat rhythms. Eventually it settles down around two minutes in to a calm secondary tune, and then alternates between the ideas.

<u>Ukuthula - Cape Town Youth Choir (formerly Pro Cantu)</u> If you were around in the 90s, you might remember Paul Simon coming out with an album featuring South African singers. We've adopted some of these songs in American churches, most famously "Siyahamba" – they're easy to sing in harmony, and Zulu is a very singable language. Here's a nice one by a South African youth choir, with the words translated under the video.
