MEDITATE

Jesus was skilled student and faithful lover of scripture, and here in a kind of street theater he enacts a passage from the ancient prophet Zechariah. The crowds fully participate in the performance, lavishing praise on the triumphant king, "humble and riding on a donkey" (Zechariah 9:9). Oliver zeroes in on the donkey himself, the humble creature carrying the humble savior, calling our attention to how even the most "lowly" can play indispensable roles in the grand drama of salvation, in Jerusalem and beyond.

"Next to the Word of God, Music Deserves the Highest Praise" -Martin Luther

<u>Dear Lord and Father of Mankind (Tune: Repton - 5vv)</u> This is a favorite hymn. C.H.H. Parry, who wrote the music, was probably the best-known Edwardian church musician, made famous by his setting of Blake's poem "Jerusalem" as a fundraiser during WWI. In both cases, a wide-ranging melody with an active bass line sets rather dense, literary poetry for a glorious effect when sung by a large group in a large space.

Schubert, Trio No. 2, Op. 100, Andante con moto | Ambroise Aubrun, Maëlle Vilbert, Julien Hanck The first melody of this movement has been used in a lot of films and TV shows. It's actually a Swedish folk tune Schubert had heard at a concert. The trio is one of the last pieces Schubert wrote and actually heard before his death at 31.
